
Washington County Site Redevelopment Program and City of West Bend Recognized by US EPA Region 5

EPA Region 5 Brownfields Success - West Bend, Wisconsin Affordable Housing

Background:

The Barton Elementary School was closed by the West Bend school district in 2013. The City of West Bend and the Washington County Site Redevelopment Program (SRP) identified the 7-acre site's potential for affordable housing.

Approach:

- Washington County SRP utilized \$39,000 in EPA Brownfields Grant funds to perform Phase 1 and 2 site assessments in 2018.
- Washington County SRP worked with the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources to develop a remedial action plan in concert with site reuse planning.
- The property was put out for bid and sold to a Low-Income Housing developer in December 2018.
- The affordable housing capital stack eventually totaled \$9.4 million, plus a \$6.7 million construction loan.

Capital Stack Sources

- √ \$39,000 in EPA grant funds for environmental assessments and soil management planning
- ✓ \$4,785,900 Affordable Housing Tax Credit Equity from Red Stone Equity Partners through WHEDA's Allocation of Affordable Housing Tax Credits
- ✓ \$1,700,000 WHEDA First Mortgage
- ✓ \$250,000 Capital Magnet Funds
- ✓ \$415,000 Home Consortium
- √ \$510,000 AHP Grant-Federal Home Loan Bank of Chicago
- √ \$1,000,000+ WEDC State Historic Tax Credits
- ✓ \$1,000,000+ Federal Historic Tax Credits

In addition to the permanent financing sources, BMO Harris Bank has also provided the project with a \$6,700,000 construction loan.

Results:

Work is underway to renovate the former school building into a 22-unit apartment complex and to construct 18 new townhomes on the property. The former school gym will remain open for recreational use and the former school library will become a community room. Completion is expected in early 2020.
